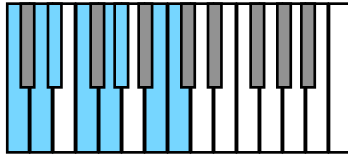


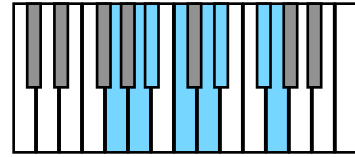
# Harmonic Minor Scale Diagrams in 12 Keys

C minor



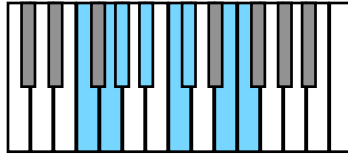
C minor has the same key signature as E $\flat$  major (three flats). C minor is the relative minor of E $\flat$  major.

G minor



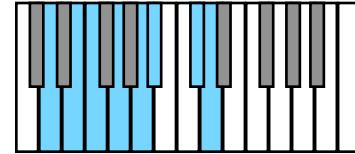
G minor has the same key signature as B $\flat$  major (two flats). G minor is the relative minor of B $\flat$  major.

F minor



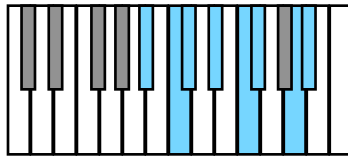
F minor has the same key signature as A $\flat$  major (four flats). F minor is the relative minor of A $\flat$  major.

D minor



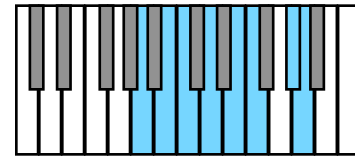
D minor has the same key signature as F major (one flat). D minor is the relative minor of F major.

B $\flat$  minor



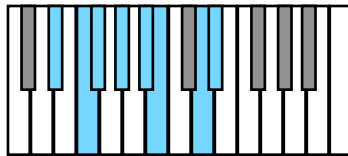
B $\flat$  minor has the same key signature as D $\flat$  major (five flats). B $\flat$  minor is the relative minor of D $\flat$  major.

A minor



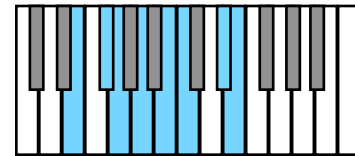
A minor has the same key signature as C major (no sharps or flats). A minor is the relative minor of C major.

E $\flat$  minor



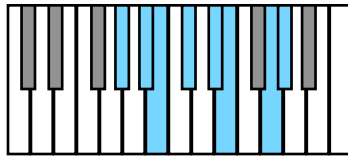
E $\flat$  minor has the same key signature as G $\flat$  major (six flats). E $\flat$  minor is the relative minor of G $\flat$  major.

E minor



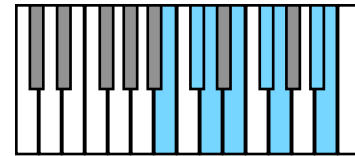
E minor has the same key signature as G major (one sharp). E minor is the relative minor of G major.

G $\sharp$  minor



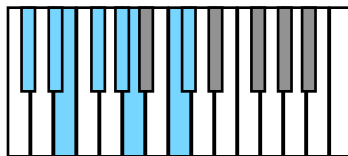
G $\sharp$  minor has the same key signature as B major (five sharps). G $\sharp$  minor is the relative minor of B major.

B minor



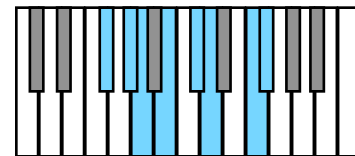
B minor has the same key signature as D major (two sharps). B minor is the relative minor of D major.

C $\sharp$  minor



C $\sharp$  minor has the same key signature as E major (four sharps). C $\sharp$  minor is the relative minor of E major.

F $\sharp$  minor



F $\sharp$  minor has the same key signature as A major (three sharps). F $\sharp$  minor is the relative minor of A major.
