Script Excerpt and Song

<u>Wendy</u> Boy without a shadow, I don't know who you are, but you're one of the most interesting people I've ever met.

> Peter Pan Thank you. I agree.

<u>Wendy</u> Where are you from?

<u>Peter Pan</u> A land you've never heard of.

> <u>Wendy</u> Never?

<u>Peter Pan</u> Never-Never.

<u>Wendy</u> Well... will you tell me then?

> <u>Peter Pan</u> I just did.

> > <u>Wendy</u> When?

<u>Peter Pan</u> Two answers ago.

<u>Wendy</u> You said, "Never-Never."

<u>Peter Pan</u> That's it. That's the Land.

<u>Wendy</u> Where is this Never-Never Land?

<u>Peter Pan</u> Come to the window and you'll see. (Peter leads Wendy to the window.) It's way up there.

> <u>Wendy</u> (with wonder) In the stars?

<u>Peter Pan</u> Second to the right, and then straight on till morning!

(She looks at Peter. Her heart has been won over.) Boy without a shadow... may I ask your name?

> <u>Peter Pan</u> (bowing) I'm Peter... Peter Pan!

<u>Wendy</u> It's nice to meet you. My name is...

> Peter Pan and Wendy Wendy!

<u>Wendy</u> You know my name?

<u>Peter Pan</u> Yes, from your diary.

<u>Wendy</u> You've been reading my diary?

<u>Peter Pan</u> Only the first page. Then your dog chased me out the window. That's how I lost my shadow.

<u>Wendy</u> So you came back to get your shadow?

Peter Pan No, actually... I came back... to find you.

> <u>Wendy</u> You did?

Peter Pan Yes. Didn't you say, "Something is calling my heart, and my heart is listening... but I don't know what it is."?

> *Wendy* How did you know that?

<u>Peter Pan</u> Your words bounced off the stars, and I heard them when I flew past.

> <u>Wendy</u> You can fly?

<u>Peter Pan</u> Of course. How else do you get from one adventure to another?

(with longing) I don't know anything about adventure. I'm always here. <u>Peter Pan</u> But you have a family... and a home.

<u>Wendy</u> Don't you have a family and a home?

<u>Peter Pan</u> (looking down) No. I don't even have a shadow.

<u>Wendy</u> Wait here. I have an idea. (She gets the sewing box and returns.) This may hurt a little, but only for a moment, and then your shadow will be as good as new.

> <u>Peter Pan</u> (watching as Wendy works) What are you doing?

Wendy I'm sewing your shadow back on. See, it takes only a few stitches. Look, it's already done.

> Peter Pan Sewing? Stitches? What is this?

<u>Wendy</u> Didn't your mother ever take a needle and thread, and work with it to make clothing, or patch up a torn place?

> <u>Peter Pan</u> I don't have a mother.

<u>Wendy</u> Peter... you don't have a mother?

> <u>Peter Pan</u> (looking down) No.
